Stay Safe.

With reopening plans moving forward, we have received more questions raised about **commercial aquatic facilities**. Throughout the region, health departments have recognized that the start-up, proper maintenance, and operation of equipment are essential to public health even as the facilities remain closed for public use. See recent announcements below from New York State including Suffolk and Nassau Counties.

NESPA has been working with government officials on plans for opening commercial pools for public use and what steps can be taken now to position these facilities for an eventual opening. Consideration is being given to how to best incorporate social distancing and other safety guidelines in a public pool environment.

Connecticut

Last week Governor Lamont detailed the criteria Connecticut will use to reopen businesses starting May 20th. The reopening plan consists of four phases. Each phase will ease restrictions or open

businesses based on how social distancing and the other health risk assessments can be managed. **Pool Service and Construction continue to be an essential service in the State** and are able to operate while following safety guidelines. **Connecticut Resource page**

New Jersey

While non-essential construction has been stopped since April 11th, companies that submitted permit applications prior to that date should contact their local permit building officials to determine if those projects have been issued permits and can begin work. NESPA continues to **advocate for the reopening of pool construction in New Jersey with** state officials. New Jersey Resource page.

New York

Empire State Development has recently stated the **opening and maintaining of commercial pools in New York is an essential service**. This statement was also echoed by the **Suffolk** and **Nassau County** Departments of Health. The DOH sent notice to bathing facility owners/operators that "all public swimming pools must be maintained and operated" even as public swimming is prohibited. Pennsylvania

Governor Wolf has shared the state's phased approach to reopening which can be viewed here. As part of this plan, the Governor has taken a county by county approach to reopening in the State. Earlier this month (5/1), **pool industry construction reopened.** Companies working in construction must comply with new safety guidelines. Our latest webinar brought together leaders in the industry to discuss how they have built a culture of training and education within their businesses, and how others can do the same.


