Connecticut

Governor Lamont announced that Phase 2 of Connecticut's reopening has been moved up by three days to Wednesday, June 17th.

While construction, service and essential retail has been able to operate since March, Phase 1 allowed for non-essential retail and offices to reopen. Retail and office operations that opened as part of Phase 1 must self-certify that you are following strict safety guidelines to keep your employees and customers safe.

New Jersey

Today, it was announced that **municipal and private-club swimming pools can REOPEN on Monday, June 22nd**. The New Jersey Department of Health will release full guidance tomorrow (June 9th) relating to the procedures and protocols that each facility will need to follow. We will share the guidance as soon as it is available.

Last week, Governor Murphy announced that New Jersey will enter Stage 2 of its reopening on Monday, June 15. In Stage 2, **non-essential retail will be able to offer in-store shopping** as long as safety guidelines are followed, and the store is kept at a reduced capacity.

New York

New York City enters Phase 1 of reopening today (June 8). This is the last region in the State to enter this phase. The New York City Department of Buildings released city specific [guidance for construction work in Phase 1](#). Hudson Valley and Long Island regions could reach the Phase 2 of reopening later this week.

Last week, [Suffolk County Department of Health Services](#) announced that outdoor public pools are allowed to operate and have public swimming if the facility follows CDC and State Department of Health Guidelines. We are in contact with other counties to see if similar guidance will be given for their communities.

Pennsylvania

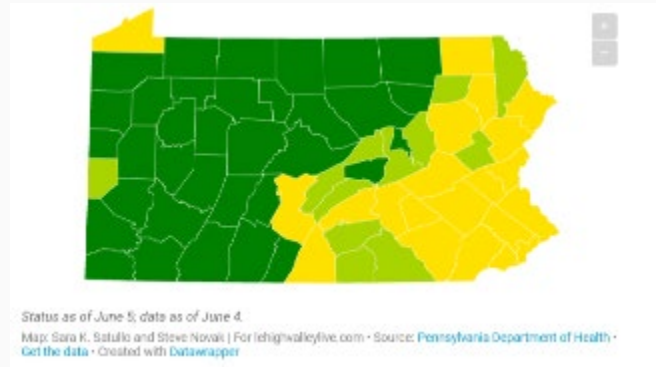
On June 5th, the last 10 counties in the State entered the yellow phase. They included Berks, Bucks, Chester, Delaware, Lackawanna, Lancaster, Lehigh, Montgomery, Northampton and Philadelphia.

Under the yellow phase, retail locations will be able to open in-store operations if they follow state guidance though curbside pick-up and delivery is still preferred.

In counties that have been designated as in the Green Phase, all businesses (including those restricted or prohibited in the Yellow Phase) are authorized to conduct in-person operations as long as the businesses follow CDC and Department of Health guidelines and other state guidance.
